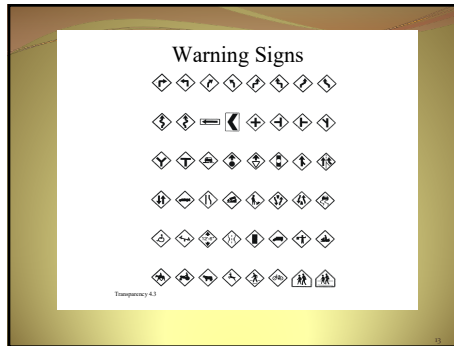
- Shape – generally with the exception of route markers

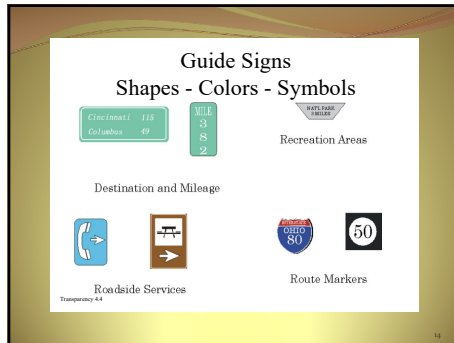

STANDARD 3-PHASE SIGNAL
RED = STOP **YELLOW = SLOW AND PREPARE TO STOP**
GREEN = GO, IF CLEAR TO DO SO

- Vertical light
- Horizontal light
 - Red / Left
 - Yellow / Center
 - Green / Right
- Delayed light – a pause before turning green
- Flashing light – STOP
- Flashing **YELLOW** light – slow down and proceed

TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES & LAWS

Lane use signals: over reversible lanes

- Lane is closed.
- Lane closure is imminent.
- Lane is open.

1st

2nd

3rd

Green arrow – lane open for use
 Steady yellow "X" – safely leave this lane, it closes soon
 Flashing yellow "X" – may use lane for left turns only
 Red "X" – do not drive in this lane

TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES & LAWS

Pedestrian Signals

"Walk" – Pedestrians may proceed across
 Flashing "Don't Walk" – Pedestrians in the street may proceed, others should not
 Steady "Don't Walk" – Pedestrians should not enter the street

TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES & LAWS


Other Signals



Left Green Arrow – turn left only, checking oncoming traffic first
Right Green Arrow – turn right only, yield to pedestrians or cross street
Yellow Arrow (either direction) – prepare to STOP
Red Arrow (either direction) – do not proceed in that direction

RIGHT-OF-WAY RULES

WHEN MUST A DRIVER YIELD?

What is right-of-way? It is a privilege
Who has right-of-way? No one. It is given, not taken

Yield situations

- ❑ To emergency vehicles - pull to the right and stop
- ❑ To pedestrians - in crosswalks, driveways, etc.
- ❑ To blind pedestrians - white cane or guide dog, or anywhere
- ❑ At stop signs - to cross traffic, pedestrians
- ❑ At traffic lights - to vehicles/pedestrians in intersection
 - o 4 way stop - first there, first to go. Arrive at same time, yield to the vehicle on the right
- ❑ At left turns - to oncoming traffic and pedestrians on cross street
- ❑ At uncontrolled intersections - to vehicles in intersection or if there at same time, yield to the vehicle on the right
- ❑ At yield signs - to cross traffic or pedestrians
- ❑ Entering from driveway - yield to traffic on cross street
- ❑ Lane ends or is blocked - yield to following vehicles or oncoming vehicles
- ❑ At freeway merge - to traffic on the freeway
- ❑ At traffic circles - to vehicles in the circle
- ❑ To funeral processions - to vehicles on cross street

When Stopping.....Think:

YIELD OR STOP?

- Must stop first
- May turn right if there is no sign prohibiting after yielding to everyone!
- Must have a clear view of the turn

Can this be legal?

- Ohio Law allows a Left turn on red from a one-way street turning left onto a one-way street.
- Must stop first
- May turn left if there is no sign prohibiting it after yielding to everyone!
- Must have a clear view of the turn

STOP & YIELD



- Must Stop & Yield to a stopped school bus when it is loading or unloading passengers
- Generally the sign / light system is activated by the Bus Driver
- Ohio Law mandates that you must stop not less than 10 feet from a bus on a non-divided highway with three or fewer lanes of traffic
- Four lanes of traffic (divided or not) only the traffic moving in the same direction as the School Bus must stop

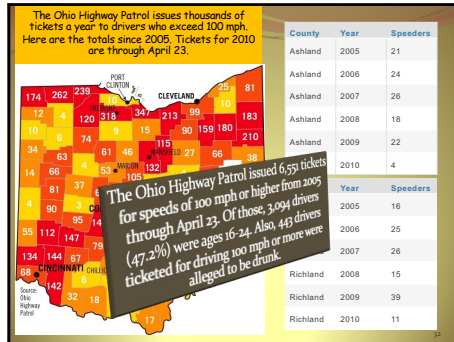

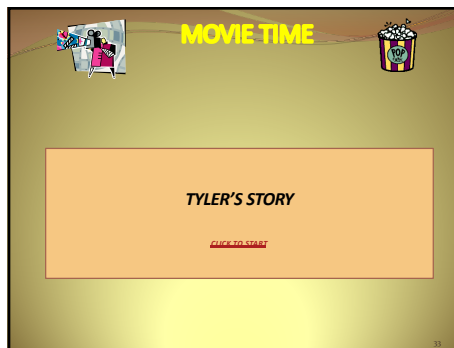

SPEEDING CAN BE 0, 2, OR 4 POINTS




